Analysis:

The imported newcomers had their first taste of competition in the day's opener and though supported by a small field, resulted in a decent enough race . Last year's winner was the smart Purr Class, and while this year's has a long way to go before reaching a similar status, she's off on the right foot with this smooth effort from the front. By the American speedster Hook And Ladder, **BYHOOKORBYCREEK** is bound to enjoy these shorter trips early on and saw off the competition in good style, winning readily at the minimum trip. She'd been well supported in the betting market after sizzling morning work-outs, and returned that confidence with a just effort. Purchased for a relatively meager fee at the OBS April sale, the connections are surely hoping for a success story in the vein of Bram Stoker (if not better), who also shares the same trainer. **Greeley Gone West** was the only one to seriously threaten the winner, and looks another promising purchase for part-owner Luther G. Miller III. The well-related son of El Corredor traveled well for Latchman, but had no answer for the winner's final furlong spurt. **Royal Spirit** pressed the leader for two-thirds of the way, and ran a decent race despite looking quite green when under pressure late.

Also worth mentioning is that in winning here, rider Jalon Samuel has graduated to the ranks of 3-lb claimer with this score and judging from his record thus far is unlikely to remain at this level for too long. [ROG]

Analysis:

The local juveniles were up next in a contest that would eventually be dominated by the form horses. As expected the first two home took their place ahead of the rest, but not in the order that the betting suggested. The well-fancied **ISTANBUL** jumped to an early lead and sprung a surprise on pre-race favourite Fernandina, hanging tough in the lane to assure yet another runner-up place for that horse. Though not a flashy looker, the son of Thady Quill looks like a useful type in the making and continued the good fortunes of his breeder. The Sir Charles Williams operation has now claimed all four of the juvenile contests thus far and with many others yet to be tested, more success may be on the horizon. **Fernandina** was again bridesmaid, finding another to go better than she was in the absence of her only other conqueror, Slip Stream. Perhaps the major excuse on her behalf would be having the disadvantage of racing from widest berth at the 1100-metre start. Debutante **Aureuserious** was well-beaten by the first two, but deserves some credit for the run. The half-sister to champion Areutalkintome seemed to have enjoyed the outing having taken a furlong or so to figure out what was required of her. Another precocious-looking type, she rallied steadily from off the pace to take third late and should be a better horse next time out. [ROG]

Analysis:

Finally a winning run for the highly-thought of **UP THE ANTE**, who turned in a thrilling performance to punch his maiden ticket. The handsome chestnut colt has been fairly unpredictable in his career so far, but glimpses of his true potential have been apparent at times. He relished the drop in company here, and hopefully this confidence boosting win will set him along a straight path to finally fulfilling that promise. His backers would've been a bit anxious after he was still far off the gallop when clearing the hill, but jockey Samuel (now a 3-lb claiming apprentice) hadn't gone for him yet and still had a lot of horse to play with. The colt quickened appreciably and capitalized on an open inside lane turning for home, safely bagging the result in the final panel. Runner-up **Heavenly Angel** was a loud whisper beforehand and as expected showed some improvement here. The Edward Walcott trainee cruised smoothly into contention three furlongs out, and almost had it won until confronted by the winner towards the end. Reproducing similar form will almost certainly assure her a win against similar company next time out. **Cassanova's** eight previous tries provided nothing to compare with his effort today though well-beaten by the first two. It'll take another similar showing to be fully convicted to viewing this as true improvement, so perhaps one should tread cautiously in backing him heavily for now. [ROG]

Analysis:

Quite a poor maiden contested over perhaps the most competitive distance in local racing. Not much in line of form to go on, and resulting in a long-shot winner with a fairly well strung-out field behind him, gave it an even worst appearance. Recent Haydn Nicholls acquisition **VOICE MAIL** proved too good for a weak maiden group and shocked his opponents with an enterprising display under apprentice Affrie Ward. The son of Surya Bhagwan disputed the pace early, but assumed full control halfway through the distance and never looked like being caught. The effort was hardly one to see him progressing significantly up in the handicap, as the depth of his competition leaves a lot to be desired. **Sylvia Helen** who was in receipt of six pounds from the winner, ran a reasonable race to be second but her effort was inadequate as the bird had already flown. **Wild Dani** was always well back in the running, and got going late after struggling to keep pace initially when the chips were thrown down. Analysis:

Not a competitive handicap but a smooth effort that shouts improvement to take away from the contest. The future seemingly continues to shine brightly for the progressive colt **MINGUN TEMPLE**, who waltzed away with his third straight triumph since joining the Kendal-based operation of trainer Nunes. His manner of victory and victims on this occasion, gave another indication of the handsome fellow's lack of remorse for unequal foes, as he made light work of the field in a very professional manner. Jockey Trotman oozed confidence as he kept the pacesetter in his crosshairs through the first seven furlongs, and delivered an accurately-calculated ride that saw the colt fully in control over a furlong from the first prize. The colt continues his campaign like a well-oiled machine and bigger targets later this year are now high on the agenda. The talented racemare **Walk On By** assumed the pace-making roll soon after a furlong had been covered, as no one seemed intent on forcing the issue of an honest pace. She separated herself nicely three to four out. Though staying on well in the last quarter of a mile, she was found wanting when faced with the sustained assault of the winner. **Zoom** was well-beaten by the first two and like the others behind him, was never in a position to alter the placings of the first two. Analysis:

The success of Derby-winning team Melrose Racing & Clifton Racing continued smoothly into today's racing with Up The Ante landing his handicap in good style. A few races on and another from their yard got off the mark with **SLAMMIN' N' JAMMIN** seeing off her group with relative ease at the five and a half furlong trip. A useful looking daughter of Grand Slam, the powerfully-built bay had little trouble dismissing this group, merely hand-ridden to assure the win despite hanging a bit in the closing stages. The win was not only her first, but also that of apprentice Samuel as a 3-lb claimer - and also marked three on the day for the progressive youngster. Runner-up Most Wanted scampered away from the boxes in customary fashion and had it all her way until joined on the turn for home by the winner. The smallish chestnut stayed on in much better fashion than earlier starts and this is likely a sign of her maturity to racing. **Words Of The Wise** showed up with his best effort for quite a long time when closing to take third; another that trainer Anderson Ward seems to have rejuvenated from the older horses in his care that were initially perceived as "spent shells". Analysis:

The BTBA Sprint is not normally a heavily subscribed race, and does little to decide any divisional championship. However, on occasion it does provide us with an outstanding performance in the vein of what we've seen in this year's renewal. It was a one-sided affair from the close of entry, as there was no worthy competition for the high-class **AREUTALKINTOME** who turned in another scintillating performance to land the relatively valuable first prize. The showpiece looked more like a morning breeze rather than a muscle-burning sprint, and the colt galloped smoothly to his tenth career win with embarrassing ease. The others would've been even father back had jockey Trotman seriously pressed the son of Zwick and done so sooner, and of those, Dark Knight got closest (the official margin having done little justice to the true measure of the romp). The runner-up easily took second from a properly cooked Super Star just over a furlong out but had absolutely no chance of catching the winner who was by then practically home and dry. Mystical Magic was never on terms really, and in closing late only just got by Super Star in the final furlong for third. The race itself perhaps needs a review by its organisers, with alterations to the conditions or criteria for entry being among the considerations for a better supported race in the future. [ROG]

Analysis:

Another smooth success for the Stephen Bynoe inmate DESERT ORCHID, who slammed her field with something in hand over 7.8 furlongs. It was always a challenge finding one to beat the heavily supported winner, as she's been in the first three for most of her career thus far; failing to collect a cheque on just three occasions since her debut last year. The well-grown daughter of Janak was venturing farther than the popular sprints for the second time here (following a game second last time out), and saw out the distance well for jockey Latchman. She's a horse who travels well irrespective of the pace, and its left to be seen how much longer a journey is within her capabilities. That said, she's quite happy up to this trip and will continue being a difficult horse to conquer once connections continue to sensibly place her. Uneverno made a likeable move around the two-furlong marker but failed to find enough when the winner finally kicked. Zaltarr perhaps lost his chance at the gate, though beating the winner was always a difficult task for the gelding. He came menacingly to that horse's shoulder just after the hill and was visibly under pressure when drifting wide just over a furlong out. [ROG]
