Analysis: Trainer Victor Cheeseman reiterated the strength well-being of his juveniles this year when for the second time, he copped a 1-2 finish. His current two-year-old standout **VANITY AFFAIR** pulled victory from the jaws of defeat with another smart win, and lasted home ahead of **Nekitta** in ground conditions which were to this point foreign to the winner. Obtained in a different fashion to her all-the-way debut triumph, the daughter of Janak showed at least a touch of class when recovering from what seemed like an assured beating about two furlongs from home. While the winner was digging deep to peg back the leader, the eventual runner-up (and previous runner-up to **VANITY AFFAIR** in their last meeting) **Nekitta** gave another very creditable display, bearing down menacingly at the death after looking hopelessly in trouble at the top of the hill. The most experienced of the lot, she's been very consistent to this point and looks set to continue making her presence felt in this division. **High Tide** was the only other with any form to recommend her as a factor in the race, and the attractive filly showed another level of improvement. She now looks a fitter individual, but it's highly likely that (based on her running style and pedigree) she'd be at her best when venturing beyond sprint distances. Receiving another decisive beating, and up to 9lbs from the winner and runner-up, she clearly still has lots of improvement to do if she's to compete seriously with the leading duo of her class.

Analysis: For the second year running, Kendal Stables under the care of Jamaican-born trainer Andrew Nunes has produced the year's Derby winner. While last year's winner obliged as the just favourite, this year's heroine outran her rivals at 35-1 to cap what has been a red-letter year for her sire. While noticeably a smart filly from her very first start, the lightly-raced daughter of Happy Memories had not yet done enough to warrant greater support in the betting market. Until she reproduces similar form it's difficult to determine the true measure of the filly's class (having just one run against this group in the past, and a troubled run it was), but her suitability to the distance surely made up for any lack of star quality she may have. If that proves true, it would only serve to confirm that on a given day and with the right circumstances present, a genuine horse can go from an unknown status to immortality in history. Of the beaten favourites, **Summer Time** was the one to salvage the most self-respect when making the winner earn every bit of the glory she achieved. Winner of the second-leg in impressive fashion, the "Jack" Stanton charge had no solid excuses for not winning and was game loser of which one can be proud. Another from the seventh crop of the Woodman horse Happy Memories, she too enjoys any extra ground to cover and continues to be an exciting prospect for some of next year's big staying prizes. Completing a 1-2-3 for the fillies was the unlucky **Open Secret**, also from the Nunes barn. Allowed to relax well off the pace and along the rail for most of the way, the daughter of a former Derby winner found herself in trouble behind beaten horses at a critical stage, ultimately conceding a further advantage to the first two and possibly a much closer finish. Stamina is obviously her forte however, and she can be expected to contest other big prizes over a distance of ground close to or identical to today's trip. The biggest disappointment in the even was raging favourite Aston Martin who could manage a depressing eighth. Despite being shuffled back in the order after a rough start, he was hustled over the next three furlongs to a more prominent position and this ought to have affected his chances of a stronger (and higher) finish.
